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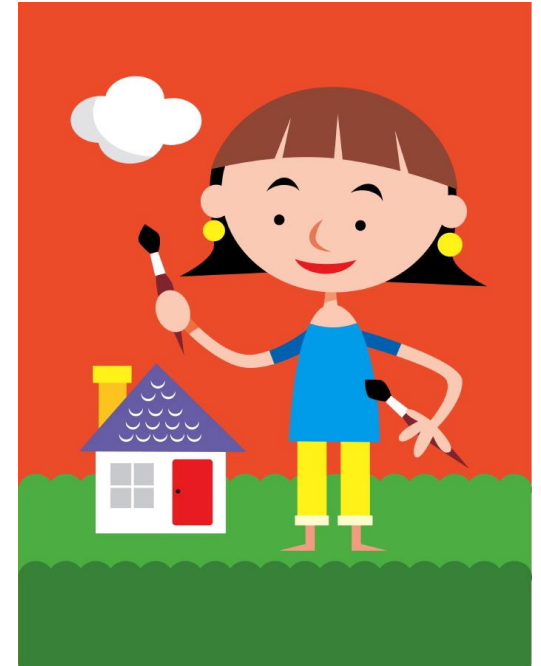

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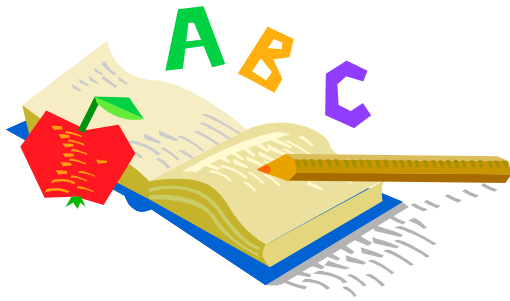

Child Screening Process for Families and their Children, Birth through 5 years



Screening Times

- Initial enrollment for District Preschools
- Parent Request
- Beginning of the School Year
- Community-Based Child Fairs held periodically

Clear Creek School District currently uses a variety of screening tools including Standardized Screeners and Parent Checklists.

Developmental Areas Assessed During the Screening Process

Adaptive and Self Help Skills

Cognitive and Pre-Academic Skills

Speech and Language Skills

Personal/Social Skills

Fine and Gross Motor Skills

Vision and Hearing Levels

With Parent Permission, other information can be reviewed, such as health history, etc.



Purpose of Screening

- Provides each family with standardized data on a child's development
- Gives preschool directors data for available funding resources to share with families
- Guides preschool instructional and programming decisions
- Becomes an initial step in the Child Find special education referral process
- Provides families of very young children a current picture of their child's developmental level
